Southern trade hub

Madrid maintains the status of an essential point for the transit of goods, both in the Iberian Peninsula and in North Africa and Southern Europe. Its privileged geographical location makes the region a vital logistics point for Spain, although the recession has slowed the growth. Head office of the 75% of the transportation and distribution companies both national and international which operates from Spain, the Region takes advantage of its location to move the 10.7% of national freight traffic. It also has Barajas airport, which comprises 50% of international traffic and 74% of the national. As vessel traffic, and despite the distance of the sea, the Puerto Seco of Coslada connects the region directly to the four largest ports in the country, which generate 90% of container's traffic in Spain.
