Spain asked Brussels for the 16th artery, the Mediterranean and Cantabrian axes.

Spain will not drive one trans-European freight corridor, but three at a time and under the same project. To ward off the specter of conflict among autonomies, the Public Works Minister, José Blanco, told yesterday to the President of the autonomous government in Extremadura, José Antonio Monago, and their counterparts in Castilla-La Mancha, Andalusia, Madrid and Aragon, that the Spain Government will present to the European Commission a basic network of rail freight transport.
